HISTORICAL COUNTY EXPENDITURES FOR COSTS RELATED TO OCEANSIDE VILLAGE ROADS¹

Tillamook County expended a total of \$285,360 for costs related to roads inside the proposed boundary of "Oceanside Village" from 2011 through 2024 – an average of \$19,204. (See table below.) These amounts were <u>not</u> adjusted to reflect inflation.

During the 2022 incorporation initiative, Public Works Director estimated that ongoing maintenance costs for all of unincorporated roads (after they are paved) would cost roughly \$30,000 a year. This figure must be adjusted upward for inflation, and downward to reflect Oceanside Village roads only.

Tillamook County expends an additional \$5000 a year for seasonal removal and replacement of cement planking and vulnerable sections of the stair way railings on the Oceanside Beach Wayside beach access ramp.

These costs do not include **\$2.3 million** expended as the Tillamook County's share of the federally-funded restoration of Cape Meares Loop Road between 2020 through 2025.
